

Juliet was in crisis... She required a network of care. Donations make this possible.

Juliet was young, very pregnant, and living far from home with her boyfriend and his friends. He abused her and went to jail. His friends threw her out. She was alone and suddenly homeless.

She went to Kennett Area Community Service (KACS) for help with housing. Baby Eddie decided to make a surprise appearance. KACS sprang into action.

KACS staff were the ones who picked her up from the hospital with her newborn, found her a hotel room for the night, and connected her with Family Promise.

At Family Promise, Juliet and Eddie found safe shelter and a team of caring people.

YoungMoms stepped in to teach her about how to be a good parent and plan a future.

CRISIS INTERVENTION

- 4,302 people didn't go hungry
- 637 victims of domestic violence received help
- 1,820 people obtained emergency housing assistance



PROMOTING STABILITY AND SUSTAINABILITY

- 1,917 isolated seniors enjoyed company at the senior center
- 1,303 people received affordable or free dental care
- 139 low-income working families were given scholarships to daycare



TRANSITIONING TO INDEPENDENCE THROUGH EDUCATION

- 395 adults learned to read
- 930 kids didn't have to go home to an empty house
- 125 teens learned to become great moms
