How Would You Give Away \$1 Million? We call it our "Allocations" process.

UWSCC invites donors who have gifted us with their donations to sit on Allocations panels. Each March, these 50 to 70 volunteers study the notebooks we give them on local non-profits' funding requests and then spend a few days hearing directly from these nonprofits about

their work, deliberating on the needs of our community versus the requests, and ultimately, voting on how to allocate the dollars raised by United Way within our community.

This is a headline we hope we never see. The reality is that homelessness IS at an all-time high in southern Chester County. Low-wage workers are growing scarce. Why? Because affordable housing options virtually no longer exist. What is out there now demands higher rents...

DID YOU KNOW?

TO AFFORD A 2 BEDROOM APARTMENT IN SOUTHERN CHESTER COUNTY, YOU NEED TO HAVE A HOUSEHOLD INCOME OF \$48,400.

MINIMUM WAGE IN PA IS ONLY \$7.25 PER HOUR, OR \$15,080 A YEAR.

United Way, along with our nonprofit partners, works in a coalition bringing together local government officials, private industry, and real estate developers to create tangible solutions.

This housing situation has the potential to change the landscape of our community—to become a CRISIS—and that affects us all. Businesses will not be able to hire employees locally because those employees can't afford to live here and moved to another county or Delaware. Or multiple families crowd into one apartment. Or they become homeless. But not if we can get ahead of it first...
